

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation will be hosting a business meeting and a public involvement meeting to discuss the upcoming US 41 Project construction and 60-day CLOSURES planned for the WIS 29 corridor including the Shawano Avenue interchange and the Packerland Drive interchange. **Note: the Shawano Avenue interchange and Packerland Drive interchange will NOT be closed concurrently.** The planned construction of a roundabout at Elmhurst Avenue/Cardinal Lane will also be discussed.

The purpose of these meetings is to provide businesses and residents with up-to-date information about:

- 2014 construction activities and the construction schedule
- The construction of a roundabout at Elmhurst Avenue/Cardinal Lane
- Alternate routes during construction and CLOSURES
- Temporary signing opportunities for businesses during construction

CONSTRUCTION TIMELINE

WisDOT is improving the US 41/WIS 29 interchange to a multilevel systems interchange with free-flow directional ramps connecting US 41 and WIS 29 (flyover ramps). The flyover ramps are planned to open in June 2014 prior to the CLOSURE and reconstruction of the Shawano Avenue interchange. Following the completion and opening of the Shawano Avenue interchange, the Packerland Drive interchange will CLOSE. **The Shawano Avenue and Packerland Drive interchanges will NOT be closed concurrently.**




ALTERNATE ROUTES DURING CONSTRUCTION

Construction of the Shawano Avenue interchange is scheduled to begin in June 2014. Shawano Avenue from Taylor Street to Packerland Drive will be CLOSED for 60 days along with US 41 ramps at Shawano Avenue. The northbound US 41 exit ramp to eastbound Shawano Avenue will only be CLOSED a maximum of 21 days within the 60-day CLOSURE. The map below depicts alternate routes identified to assist businesses and the public during the reconstruction of the Shawano Avenue interchange.
