## **Meeting purpose**

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation will be hosting a business open house to discuss upcoming construction at the Oneida Street/Waube Lane interchange which is ahead of schedule. The purpose of this meeting is to provide businesses with information about upcoming Oneida Street/Waube Lane construction staging for the summer and fall of 2015, including:

- Updated traffic impacts and closure information.
- Alternate routes.
- Temporary signing/information for businesses.

## **Meeting format**



## Construction at the Oneida Street/Waube Lane interchange and along the I-41 mainline


Major construction will continue along the I-41 mainline from Glory Road to 9th Street through the fall of 2016. Major construction will be completed at the Oneida Street interchange this fall. Construction will continue at the interchange in 2016, with intermittent lane closures and traffic impacts.


## Oneida Street/Waube Lane interchange reconstruction

With interchange reconstruction ahead of schedule, major construction and interchange improvements are planned to be completed this fall.

Improvements planned to be completed this fall include reconstructed ramp terminal intersections and safety enhancements at the Ramada Way/Oneida Street intersection. See figure below for more detail on the planned interchange configuration, designed to improve safety by restricting 'left-out' movements from Ramada Way onto Oneida Street.

For information on upcoming closures, traffic impacts, and alternate routes during construction at both Ramada Way and Allied Street, refer to *Oneida Street/Waube Lane interchange alternate routes* on the following page.





## Oneida Street/Waube Lane interchange alternate routes

Westbound and eastbound on Oneida Street/Waube Lane will be reduced to one lane in each direction. Left turn only lanes will also be included in some locations to enhance traffic flow during construction. Allied Street immediately north of Oneida Street/Waube Lane will be CLOSED for 21 days to accommodate construction. WisDOT will notify area businesses when CLOSURE dates are determined. During construction drivers may experience delays for through traffic on Oneida Street/Waube Lane between South Ridge Road and Ramada Way. Parkview Road and Hansen Road are recommended as alternative routes across I-41.

## Highway business signs

Prior to construction, businesses were advised to form associations or committees to coordinate the development of business signs and identify proposed sign locations.

As construction progresses, businesses may choose to move their temporary business signs to accommodate changes in traffic patterns. While new permit applications are not required to move existing signs to new locations, businesses need to contact Marc Roesler (920-362-1632) for approval of the new location. A business sign permit is still required for the placement of new signs.
